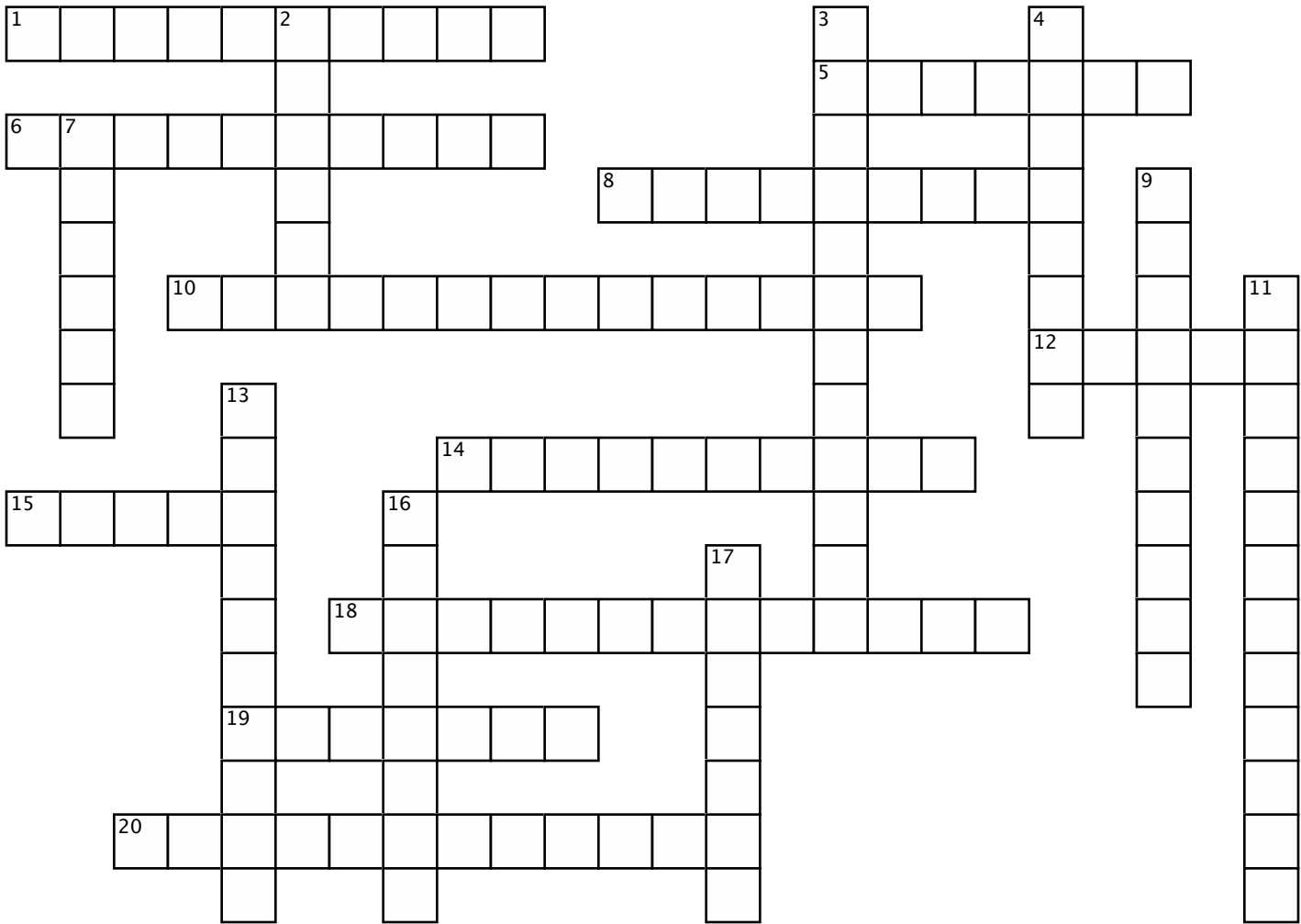


Puzzle #3: 18th Century American Colonies
